

Toolbox against discrimination

bystander (n): a person who is standing nearby and watching something that is happening but does not intervene. **harass (n):** to annoy or trouble someone repeatedly, either verbally or physically. You can also say that somebody "is harassed" or "suffers harassment".

femicide (n): the killing of women often by men and on account of her gender.

b Read this text about "The Bystander Effect".

According to the text, why did the bystanders not intervene when Kenan was harassed on the bus? Discuss in pairs.

The bystander effect is a social psychological phenomenon where individuals are less likely to offer help to a person in need when other people are present. Essentially, the more bystanders there are, the less likely any one of them is to intervene. It seems that individuals feel less personal obligation to act when others are around.
